

THUMBNAIL SKETCHES

Of the Kimberley Dynamiters

The Kimberley Dynamiters come to the Okanagan as champions of the W.I.H.L. after going through a bruising series with the Nelson Maple Leafs. The Kootenay team features a number of home minor hockey products. With many of the players well known to Okanagan hockey fans.

Goal Jerry Fodey. Fodey has had lots of experience in both pro and amateur company, having played for Port-land and Seattle. The last four years he has been with the Spokane Flyers.

Spare goalie Earl Betker. Has been with the club two seasons, also having played here in the Okanagan for both Vernon and Kamloops. Has been out with injuries,

Defence, Bill Jones. Another two year man with the club. Terrific checker, is about 5 ft. 9 ins. and weighs in at about 185 lbs.

Defense, Barry Craig. With the team for two seasons. Stands about 6 ft. and tips the scales at over 200 lbs. Standout defenseman in the Kootenay league.

Defense, Gordon Andre. Also a second year man. Is rough and tough, hands out body checks with authority. Is 5 ft. 8 inches and weighs about 185. Watch him.

Defense, Bill "Tank" Johnson. Has been with the club since before the war. Has always been rated near the top. Is one of the real old timers with the team.

Defense, Ted Lebodia. Played three years in the Western Canada junior league with Crows Nest. Then stepped up to the Seattle Ironmen. Is one of the keymen on the point, picking up many goals this year from that spot.

Forward, Cal Hockley. This is his third year with the Dynamiters. A right winger, standing about 5 ft. 9 ins. and weighs 180 lbs. Well up in the scoring over there.

Forward, Gerry Barre. Was with the club in 51-52 and 52-53. Then went overseas to play in England. Rejoined the club this year.

Forward, Buzz Mellor. Well known to the Valley fans. Played in Kamloops and Vernon. Has been with this club for four years. Plays center and was well up near top of scoring heap.

Forward, Nip Knippleberg. Comes from Melville. Played for Kelowna, and started this season with Kamloops. Plays wing and shoots from the right side.

Forward, Claude Bell. 5 years with the club. Ended season 2nd in scoring. Started hockey with the Kootenay minor hockey clubs. Plays wing and shoots left.

Forward, Ray McNiven. Been with club four or five years. Has played for Vernon. Is a left winger and weighs about 155 lbs.

Forward, Buck Kavanaugh. The old timer of the team. Has been playing intermediate this season. Plays left wing and is about 180 lbs.

Coach and center, Norm Larson. Played pro for Calgary, then went to Kamloops, going to Kimberley two years ago as playing coach. Is tough man to keep from in front of opposition nets.




