The Canadians go into tonight's game holding a one game advantage over the Spokane Flyers after their win in the American City last Saturday night.

Two of the players wearing the Flyers' uniform are former Canadians, Jackie Miller and Johnny Sofiak. Miller went to Spokane two seasons ago and has been with the club ever since. Sofiak has done a lot of travelling since his stay in Vernon, he has donned the sweaters of Kamloops Elks, the Vees, and finally stayed put in Spokane. Miller missed Saturday's game in Spokane due to a two game suspension arising from a fracas he had with Bobby Kromm of the Smokies. He had previously sat out a game before Saturday.

Most of the Canadians came out of the last game free of injuries, with the exception of the odd bruise here and there. Also the flu bug is being kept away from the door.

The next game will be played down in Penticton and it is hoped that there will be the usual large crowd of Canadian fans on hand to form another large caravan to the southern city. Could be that the caravan will leave the arena at about 4:30. Saturday night's game will be over in Trail, both teams travelling sometime Friday.

Looks like Winnipeg will be travelling west as they are leading Ft. William two games to nil in the western Canada semi-finals, Sudbury leads the Abitibi Eskies 3 games to 2. Their series ends this week. Chatham is awaiting the winner to play off for the Ontario title, and to see who meets the Atlantic seaboard winner. Western Canada finals are slated to get under way out here on about April 2nd.

Word has it that there were nearly 200 fans from B.C. to cheer the Canadians on down in Spokane, and a great number of these fans were from Penticton, and as far north as Salmon Arm. Each time that these two teams tangle the fans can be assured of a real game, and we should see packed houses from here on in.
